The month of September is very special for us, the members of the Society of the Divine Word. It was in this month that the Society was founded on 8th September 1875. The beginnings, by an unassuming yet




holy person who always wanted to discern the will of God shown to him in very difficult times, were very humble and awe inspiring. His only treasures were his faith and utter confidence in the Providence of God. When we now look back after 145 years of its existence, we recognize that St. Arnold was a prophet of his time and a saint of our times, who obeyed the will of God in founding the Congregation of the Society of the Divine Word and also two Sisters' Congregations dedicated to the vivifying Spirit of God. The congregations have grown and branched into all the continents living the spirit of the Founder and carrying out the mission of establishing the Kingdom of God. Within a

few years, the Society of the Divine Word will be celebrating the 150th anniversary of its Foundation. This therefore is an appropriate time that calls for retrospection, the need to seriously begin to assess how far the members of the Society of the Divine Word have lived up to the Vision of the Founder. It is also a time to self-examine the spirituality with which we carry forward the work entrusted to us.

Times certainly have changed since 1875, when the congregation was founded. The Society has moved from the challenges of the Victorian era and those of modernity of the founding generation to the globalized, post-modern and post-truth era of our contemporary times. The global and post-modern values are affecting our lifestyle and our mission. Consciously or unconsciously, we become victims of the allurements of this world. The awareness of the challenges of the changing world and of its values are essential to recapture the mission ideals of the Founder and recommit ourselves in our contemporary times.

Today, science and technology are increasingly powerful. Secularization is accepted as the natural and inevitable process in the development of human society. Post-modern liberal ideas have led to excessive individualism and narrow self-actualization. It is manifested in mindless and compulsive consumerism in individual lives and in the breakdown of community living. The prevailing attitude of relativism to Christian mission leads our members to ambiguity, confusion and a lack of commitment to an ideal. As a result, mission is gradually taking the back seat. The political situation in the country also adds further challenges, difficulties and confusion in our mission ideals.



As we prepare ourselves to celebrate the 146th anniversary of the Foundation Day of the Society of the Divine Word on 8th September, let us recall the spirituality and the commitment of our Founder and his generation to face the challenges of our days. If we are to be relevant today, we must rediscover our roots. This has a twofold challenge: a challenge to orthodoxy and also a challenge to be open to contemporary realities of life. It implies that we need to be a Counter Cultural witnessing community to promote the values of the Gospel. Let us remember that only a dead fish moves along the running stream, a living fish goes against the current.

St. Arnold had a special place for Mother Mary in his life. Her faith and simplicity and desire to accomplish the will of God at all times attracted

him. That is why, all the three Congregations were founded on the feast days of our Blessed Mother. On 8th September, the Foundation of the Society of the Divine Word, we celebrate the Birthday of Mother Mary. We place ourselves under the protection and patronage of Mother Mary and pray that we may live like her in our faith commitment accomplishing God's will in our lives and mission.

A JOINT VENTURE SARVA VIKAS DEEP AND CANOSSA SISTERS



The landmark events are very significant in the life of an individual, institution, organization. Sarva Vikas Deep (SVD), a social wing of the Society of the Divine Word, had completed its decennial jubilee in the year 2016 and as part of this landmark event it extended its mission territory to another block, Mhasla in Raigad district. Having operated from Mangaon since 2016, a distance of 28 kms., a contract between the INM Province, represented by Provincial, Fr. Richard Mathias and the Director of Sarva Vikas Deep, Fr. Richard Quadros, and the Canossian Sisters - India Central Province, represented by Provincial, Sr. Audrey D'Souza, was inked on

31st March 2021 and a rented house for three Sisters was blessed by the INM Admonitor, Fr. Maria Michael SVD on 18th July 2021. The partnership contract has spelt out possibilities of innovative mission ventures in empowering the tribals in Mhasla Taluka.

OVERSEAS MISSION ORIENTATION AMIDST THE PANDEMIC ISHVANI KENDRA, PUNE



The Overseas Mission Orientation (OMO) course is Ishvani Kendra's unique contribution to the Church in India to prepare its missionaries getting ready to serve in mission countries abroad. It was scheduled for June 2021. However, with the second wave of the Covid-19 pandemic hitting India with devastating and tragic consequences, it had to be postponed as it became a real challenge to organize anything residential. By the end of June, there were some indications

of the pandemic slowing down in the country and the institute took a bold decision to re-open its doors to welcome the OMO course participants from July 31 - 21August 2021. We encouraged the participants to take at least one dose of the Covid vaccine before their arrival and arranged a three-day room quarantine before the input sessions began with Covid protocols like wearing mask, maintaining safe distance etc.

We had a full house of 30 participants who came from different parts of India. It included nine SVD new priests, one Montfort brother and 20 sisters belonging to seven different religious congregations. These 30 missionaries will be going to 24 different countries in all the six continents as soon as the borders are opened. The enthusiastic missionaries were oriented with inputs on cultural and psychological transition; inter-cultural communication; faith traditions; protection of minors and sexual harassment; challenges of mission life; new religious movements; Church teachings especially on the direction of the Church with Pope Francis; and Biblical missionary discipleship. Technology also came to the fore as missionary sisters and priests of Indian origin from six different countries joined the participants live on ZOOM to share their experiences and the challenges they faced. Each participant also made a research presentation on their mission destination.

It was indeed the grace of God and Lord's protection that was at work in these challenging times as all the participants were hale and hearty and full of energy and enthusiasm. Inspired by this success, Ishvani Kendra is currently organizing a course for 31 sisters celebrating the silver jubilee of their religious profession from August 26–25 September. Now we confidently plan to go ahead with the other planned courses with care and precaution, trusting in God's providential grace.

BLESSING OF THE RENOVATED BUILDING PRARTHANA NIKETAN, KADUTHURUTHY

A long cherished desire of the staff of Prarthana Niketan, Kaduthuruthy was to have self-contained rooms for those who come for retreats and spiritual programmes. Though the renovation work of the hostel building began at the end of last year, due to Covid, it could be completed only by June 2021. One part of

the hostel block was renovated with 10 rooms each on the ground and first floors. Fr. Ginto, the Procurator of the house, worked tirelessly for the successful completion of the work.

The blessing of the re-modelled block took place on the 15th July 2021. Due to Covid restrictions general public was not invited. Our conferrers from Changanacherry, Aduvassery and Pilathara joined blessing and the celebration. The Solemn Mass was held at 11 am. Fr. Tomy Perumparayil SVD, the Vice Provincial, was the main celebrant and Fr. Titus, the Director of the centre, and Fr. Babu concelebrated. During the introduction, Fr. Titus welcomed everyone and sincerely thanked the INM Provincial administration and all the benefactors for their encouragement and financial support. The blessing of the renovated block followed the Holy Mass. A delicious lunch was served to the invitees at the end of the function. The Contractor, the Engineer and the Electrician were also invited and they were given gifts as a token of gratitude for their efficient work.

DIGITAL INDIA – A TIME TO GROW AND DEVELOP



Amidst the pandemic situation where schools have not fully opened, St. Theresa's High School had a short meaningful celebration on August 15 to honour our country. The flag hoisting ceremony on the occasion of the platinum jubilee of Independence began at the school premises with about 80 persons present. It was also telecast live on YouTube for the sake of the students and their parents, to facilitate their participation from their homes.

The national flag was hoisted by a retiring teacher, who gave a fitting message for the occasion. Prayers were offered for the country. The first three SSC toppers of



the school were felicitated. Some students performed a lovely patriotic dance. The Principal, Fr. Nicolau D'Costa SVD, spoke on balance between Rights and Duties, and between Talking and Doing. He asked those present to pray for the country as he

ZEITLER MEMORIAL WEBINAR ISHVANI KENDRA, PUNE



On the eve of the Platinum Jubilee of Indian Independence, on 14 August 2021, Ishvani Kendra organized a Zeitler Memorial Webinar focusing on the theme constitutional ideals and values of Indian democracy, particularly in the light of the arrest, custody and eventual death of Fr. Stan Swamy SJ, a tribal rights activist. The theme of the webinar was "*Fr. Stan Swamy, a beacon of hope: State of Democracy and Dissent as India Marks Platinum Jubilee of Independence.*"

Senior Advocate Dushyant Dave, a former President of Supreme Court Bar Council, dwelt on 'the state of democracy and dissent in the country,' while the Jesuit priest, Fr. Joe Xavier, the Director of Indian Social Institute in Bangalore,

shared about the life and the prophetic mission of Fr. Stan Swamy. The participants applauded the speakers and the organizers for the choice of the topic.

WELCOME AND FAREWELL PROGRAMME SVD SHISHYALAYA, VASAI



SVD Shishyalaya seminary is blessed with 22 seminarians from Vasai, Uttan, Arnala, Aurangabad, Talaserri and Nagpur. There is a good mixture of different cultures, languages and customs. We began the academic year 2021-22 with an inaugural Mass by Fr. John Lugun, the present prefect, on 19th of July. Fr. Salate, the Rector, introduced Fr. John to the community and welcomed him and the new comers. In his homily Fr. John stressed that the

Society of the Divine Word is known for reaching out to the interior missions and spreading the Gospel to the nook and corner of the world. He also talked about the mission and charism of St. Arnold and our pioneer missionaries who worked hard to build up the Society. As a symbolic gesture he handed a Bible and a Rosary to everyone and encouraged them to read the Bible every day and live it out in their daily life as our pioneer missionaries did.

In the evening, there was a short cultural programme to welcome the new comers and bid farewell to the Palda going students. During the programme, Fr. Nickson, the vocation promoter, welcomed the new comers and thanked the Palda going students. In his speech, Fr. Salate said that even though the seminary started only in 2008, within 12 years, it has formed six priests. Fr. Francis Mastan from Koliwada motivated by Fr. Callisto and Fr. Ivan joined St. Peter's Apostolic School, Kirem in the year 2005. Fr. Nickson and Fr. Louis, the first seminarians of Shishyalaya, were ordained in the year 2018. And later Fr. Sandesh, Fr. Peter and Fr. Avinash were ordained in 2019 and 2020. At present there is a deacon, Lucas Parkhe from Augrangabad who will be ordained in this academic year. In conclusion, the Rector expressed appreciation and thanked all the formators who worked in the past and also who are serving at present.

DISCIPLES OF THE DIVINE WORD (DDW) – MUMBAI



On 8th September 2019, the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the Foundation Day of the SVD, we began the 'Feed the Hungry' project. To launch the project, we cooked lunch and distributed it to the poor people living by the road-sides, slums, etc. While active and enthusiastic, our circle was small and limited.

The COVID-19 outbreak of March 2020 took everyone by surprise. SVD confreres collaborated with the DDW members and we continued with the 'Feed the Hungry' project. We provided essential food kits to more than 8000 poor families in and around Mumbai. We experienced clear signs of humaneness and compassion. It helped us to widen our circle.



This year, the devastating second wave hit us. After a brief pause due to stricter lockdown guidelines, we are again on the move, feeding the hungry. We distribute around 800-900 packets of home cooked high-protein-lunch to the poor people at the traffic signals, Cooper Hospital (a government hospital), below the flyovers, slums and of course by the road-sides. We also take along water bottles, bananas, biscuits, toiletries, etc. We are grateful to our donors and all those who support this project. We welcome

new opportunities that will bring joy to the lives of the poor, especially the children, the disabled and the sick.

Sarah (*name changed to protect identity*) said, "*I am not sad and depressed now. I look forward to Saturdays…the planning, shopping and cooking for Feed the Hungry. My daughters and I are very grateful to you.*" Hugging me she cried. Sarah's husband died of heart attack a few months ago, leaving behind his young wife and three daughters. We are grateful to God for allowing us to help some families who are going through hard times in their lives. They cook for us hot meals to distribute to the hungry people on the streets and side-walks of Mumbai. Our circle continues to grow.

We are grateful to Fr. Gregory Pinto, our Spiritual Director, who is our driving force, Fr. Tony Menezes and the Atma-Darshan community for their collaboration and support, Jayesh George for operating his family vehicle for food distribution for more than a year, Fr. Jose Arayathel, Sarva Seva Sangh, for providing the vehicle for food distribution, and Fr. Xavier Alangaram, Styler-Mission, Sankt Augustin, Germany for helping us in procuring a new vehicle for Feed the Hungry Project. We are deeply grateful to our Provincial, Fr. Richard Mathias and his leadership team for the encouragement and assistance. God bless us all!

ST. MARTHA'S DAY AS DOMESTIC HELPERS DAY



Domestic help refers to housework such as sweeping, cleaning utensils, washing clothes, cooking, caring of children and such other works which are carried out for an employer for remuneration. Domestic help provides an important source of livelihood for the illiterate women or those with very little education.

Someone speaking about the domestic helpers mentioned:

"Respect your maids because they give you a lot, take very less, bear hardships and complain nil." A famous quote by Marcel Proust says, "Let us be grateful to the people who make us happy. They are charming gardeners who make our souls blossom."

On July 29, the Church celebrates the feast of St. Martha who is the patron saint of domestic helpers. The Sisters of Apostolic Carmel and SVD Fathers from Bailhongal, being grateful for our domestic helpers, celebrated this day meaningfully. This is an occasion for us to consider even domestic helpers have their



role to play through their humble services. Though they work within the four walls they too have their dignity and rights as children of God.

St. Martha's attitude of love in action was highlighted by the Greeting Song, Power Point Presentation, Prayer Service, Gift Giving and a high tea at our dining hall. We displayed their working photos in the presentation and they were glad

to see their pictures. This made them feel that they are collaborators in our mission work. The celebration of this event appealed to us that, 'along with salary we also need to pay respect to our maids.' May our domestic helpers be joyful and graceful people in our communities!

INDEPENDENCE DAY PROGRAMME SVD SHISHYALAYA, VASAI

We the staff and students of Shishyalaya celebrated the feast of the Assumption of our Mother Mary and the 75th Independence Day very solemnly in the community. The main celebrant of the Mass was Fr.
