In this context we can bring to our mind the three Biblical images of the church:

- The body of Christ,
- The temple of the Holy Spirit.

We can also look at it from the point of view of Incarnation where God through Jesus Christ chose to commune with humanity by choosing to be born as a human person in its utter poverty and simplicity.

We further note that Jesus Christ participated and lived his whole life in all its humanness, reaching out to the poor and needy, there by fulfilling the mission entrusted to Him by His Heavenly Father by finally dying on the cross as a criminal. The synodal theme places before us a strong challenge of communion, participation and mission in both the dimensions of our religious life – Ad Intra and Ad extra. Based on the theme and what we celebrate on Christmas day we are urged to re-visit our personal life as consecrated persons.

What role do I play to build my religious community?

How do I participate in the community life to enhance it?

What is my contribution to achieve the mission entrusted to my community?

These questions should help us to move deeper into the call given by Pope Francis to the whole Church and to us to live out our commitment to communion, participation and mission.

May this December be a Holy One for us and bring in the requisite transformation in the areas of our life and mission May this month may not be another December which merely focuses on externals packed with goodies of fun and festivity but may it be a deep and meaningful journey into our deeper selves where we communion with God to participate in the mission of the Incarnate Word and his Church.

May we truly have an intimate experience of 'God with us' during this Christmas, so that when we wish one another on Christmas day we may genuinely share the positive vibes of our experience communion with Christ and thus pass on the baton of spreading the good news to the world.

safeguard the interests of workers in general and more especially the unorganized sector who constitute the poor, deprived and disadvantages sections of the society. The resource person for the day was Ms. Mishal Dabre from the 'Centre for Social Action'.

The dignitaries present were Ms. Maria Gomes from the Mumbai Migrant Desk, Fr. Paul Vattathara SVD, Director of Urban Community Development Centre, Fr. Jerome D'Souza, Director of *Maitri Sangatan*, Sr. Elizabeth and Sr. Pushpa from Chembur, and Mr. Valentie and Ms. Sushma from *Pahunch* organization. We had a total of 180 participants comprising mainly of five Women SHGs. The program began with a welcome song by the ladies of Jagruti and Ekta SHGs. The resource persons and the dignitaries were welcomed with the bouquet of flowers. The resource person explained clearly the concept and the objectives of e-SHRAM card and related schemes in a very simple language. The participants were given time for asking questions for clearing their doubts. The migrants of Chotanagpur also celebrated the festival of *Nava Khani*, meaning, the taste of the new crops (Harvest Feast). Towards the end of the training the children from *Bandh*, the migrants of Bandra Station Zone and Mount Mary Zone put up beautiful tribal cultural dances. To enhance presentation skills, "Banking Model Exhibition" was organised as a Forum Activity. A PPT competition on "Various Religions in India" was organized to mark the Constitution Day. As a step towards self-employment a Student Symposium was organized in collaboration with Cluster Colleges and FES India. Students presented Sustainable Business Models on social issues relating to Education, Women Rights, Skill Development, Health, Sanitation and Environment. To sensitize the youth on various issues of gender the following Programmes were conducted:

"Women and the Environment: The discussion came out with conclusion as solution - as there is relationship between policy making, patriarchy and climate change.

Sebastian Pottanani who gave a vision and direction to SVD Prarthana Niketan for the renewal of families through Retreats and Counselling. His noble mission and fruitful service for transforming the families were commemorated during the Solemn Holy Eucharist celebrated at 11.00 am. Rev. Fr. Justin

Madathilparambil, Vicar General of Vijayapuram Diocese was the main celebrant. The occasion was graced by the presence of SVD confreres and priests from neighbouring parishes, relatives of Fr. Sebastian, old and new team members of SVD Prarthana Niketan and the neighbours and well-wishers. At the outset of the Holy Eucharist, Fr. Titus Thattamattathil, the present director of SVD Prarthana Niketan, briefly recalled the significant moments of the ministry of Fr. Pottanani which started in 1978 and continued till 2008. Through 30 years of his zealous mission dedicated to the renewal of families countless couples have benefitted as they were healed of their wounds in their relationship with each other and their lives were transformed.

The motto of Fr. Pottanani's retreat and follow up programmes was: 'It is I, not my partner who has to be changed.' Rev. Fr. Justin, the main celebrant gave an inspiring homily, exhorting priests/committed lay persons to become like Jesus, giving comfort, peace and healing to the wounded persons in the families, following the footprints of Fr. Pottanani and a veteran missionary in Botswana gave a short narration about Fr. Pottanani's life and mission, after which he dedicated the Retreat Hall to the memory of Fr. Pottanani. CONSULTATION ON SYNOD ON SYNODALITY

We are aware of the two-year long 'Synodal Journey' which Pope Francis has initiated and which will unfold in three phases of consultations at the diocesan, the continental and the universal levels culminating in the XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops in October 2023, in Rome with the theme 'For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission.' The Holy Father has expressed his wish that this two-year long ecclesial endeavour should be a shared journey of listening, of reflection and of discernment, at all the three levels. It is our earnest wish that all of us actively get involved in the synodal process.

In this regard, in the Provincial Council meeting held from 13-15 November 2021 at SVD Provincial House, Bandra we decided to request all the LCF Coordinators to discuss the themes of the Synod in the LCF meetings with the help of materials available in the Preparatory Document and the Vademecum and send a summary report to our office by 30th January 2022 so that we can send a collated report to the Synod Desk of the CCBI who in turn will make it available for discussion when the National Consultation of the CCBI takes place.


