MOTHER MARY'S INVITATION

Mother Mary is a beautiful example of how God can transform us from ordinary persons to extraordinary ones and use us for his divine purposes. Mother Mary because of her disposition to be docile to the will of God and gift herself to God to bring forth the saviour into the world is a powerful model in our journey of life and faith. As we celebrate her nativity on 8 September, Mother Mary invites us to ponder on the significant role she played, and continues to play, in God's plan of salvation by surrendering herself to be the Ark of the New Covenant.

We first meet Mary in the Bible as a young woman set apart by God, visited by the angel Gabriel who announced to her that she was to be the mother of the Son of God, our Saviour. Her role had, in fact, been foreshadowed in the Old Testament book of Genesis (Gen. 3:15). The prophet Isaiah referred to the momentous event of the offspring to be Later, Matthew recounts through the virgin as the "Behold a virgin shall she shall give birth to a name Emmanuel, which (Mt. 1:22-23).



and even foretold the name Emmanuel (Is. 7:14). the nativity of the saviour fulfilment of the prophecy, conceive in her womb, and son. And they shall call his means: God is with us."

As Noah built the Ark to creation alive and save of the Great Flood, so too, Mary keeps human-kind 'alive' by bearing Jesus in her womb. Mary's initial God given role was to be the Ark of the New Covenant, to bring Jesus to the people in a new and special way. In Mary, God came to dwell with His people physically through the womb of a Jewish girl specially chosen and prepared. The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us that "Mary, in whom the Lord himself has just made His dwelling, is the daughter of Zion in person, the Ark of the Covenant, the place where the glory of the Lord dwells. She is "the dwelling of God...with men." Because Mary, like Noah, responded to God's call in complete obedience and trusting faith, human beings could see Jesus, touch Him, talk with Him, listen to Him, and experience His saving power. Being human, we can better relate with Jesus, the Son, whom we can see, than with a God in heaven whom we cannot see.

Mary's initial role was then expanded to include caring for Jesus in all the ways that a mother cares. She nourished Him materially doing all the things that the mothers do for their children. She also nourished Him spiritually by nurturing His faith in God, by teaching Him the values and virtues of goodness and godliness and observance of the religious practices. St. Luke tells us that Jesus advanced in wisdom, and in age, and in grace with God and men because of his willing subordination

to his parents especially his mother, Mary. When Jesus began His ministry, Mary's role was given a new dimension. At Cana, as her son was attending a wedding, she interceded for the celebrants in the matter of shortage of wine. And because of her simple faith in Him, Jesus answered her request with His first untimely miracle. Certainly, Mary had a very special relationship with Jesus and that's what prompted him to perform a miracle to save the reputation of the family. This is what, we, the Divine Word Missionaries rely on, as we take our concerns and petitions to Mother Mary. We entreat her to intercede for us to her son, Jesus, believing that her special relationship with him will effect God's positive and generous response to our needs.



As we, the present generation of Divine Word Missionaries, celebrate the foundation day of our Society coinciding with the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary; in retrospection, need to contemplate in awe, the intimacy of our founding Fathers and Sisters with Mother Mary during the beginning and development of our congregation. Certainly, she has played a pivotal role in inspiring our founding generations to lay a strong foundation on the Divine

Word, and that is why, our Society was able to withstand all the odds and challenges and grow into a powerful instrument of proclaiming God's goodness and love and bring the people to God. Today, the best birthday gift we can give to Mother Mary is to be docile to the Spirit and respond to her invitation to be an Ark of the Lord and allow her to facilitate our conformation to the image of her Son, the Incarnate Word, and grow in our mission consciousness acknowledging that 'His name is our name and our name is our mission'.

CELEBRATION OF MIGRANT YOUTH DAY IN GOA



"Mary arose and went with haste into the hill country, to a city of Judah" (Lk 1: 39). This was the theme for the National Youth Day 2022. Keeping this theme in mind, Arnold Seva Kendra, Goa (ASK, Goa) celebrated its first ever Migrant Youth Day for the Chotanagpur youth on 21 August. The Chotanagpur Youth Group Executive Committee headed by Fr. Michael Pereira SVD, came together more than a month in advance to plan out the day with a view to make this day a memorable day for the migrant youth. More than 120 youth participated in the celebration. They were divided in to seven different groups, namely, Verna, Varca, Collem, Sanvordem, Velsao, Fatorpa and Betalbatim, roughly representing the villages where they come from.

The celebration commenced with a Solemn Youth Day Eucharistic Celebration presided over by Fr. Anthony Soreng OP. This was followed by a short session by Fr. Joseph Nazareth SJ where he stressed on dreaming big and to becoming someone great in life. After a short break for refreshments, a lot of competitions, group games and dances were conducted in which the youth could display their talents and work together in their respective groups. The activities also included a Slogan contest, a colourful fashion show where the youth brought out the various cultures and traditions of India. Finally, the day ended with prize distribution and giving away of the medals. The Youth group from Collem secured the first place; Varca group begged the second place and Fatorpa group managed to get the third place. The dignitaries included Fr. Donato, the in-charge of the migrants for the diocese of Goa, Fr. Joaquim Fernandes SVD, Fr. Joseph Nazareth SJ., Fr. Blaise Lobo, assistant Youth director for the diocese of Goa and Fr. Basil SJ, the Principle of Loyola High School Margao. This was the first time the migrant youth gathered together for such a celebration. The Youth went back home with a lot of happiness and joy hoping that such celebrations would be there in the future as well.



FORMATORS' SEMINAR



The time and space dimensions of human existence demand that everything human must evolve and change. This applies to the field of religious, missionary formation as well. That is why; our formation programme envisages regular ongoing formation for the formators. Inspired by this vision, a two-day Formators' Seminar in two batches was organized for all the formators of India Sub-zone on August 12 & 13 and 16 & 17. The venue was the recently built, state-of-the-art convention centre, Snehalaya, Indore. The resource person was Fr. Joe Mathias, SJ, former Rector of Papal Seminary, and former Director of NVSC, Pune. The seminar was entitled "The Role of the Formators in facilitating the process towards Integral Formation". 50 confreres participated in the seminar.

With the help of relevant Church documents dealing with formation and with insights gleaned from experts in the field of developmental psychology, Fr. Mathias familiarized the participants with the concept of "integral formation". He then proceeded to help them understand the precise role that a formator must play in facilitating the transformation of the formandi. The sessions were made vibrant by spirited interactions and lively discussions from the part of the participants in addition to the stirring presentation of the topics by the resource person.

The Provincial of INC, Fr. Joemon Alackal, took keen interest in the conduct of the seminar through frequent enquiries about the progress of its preparations, by officiating at the Inaugural Eucharist of both the batches and then giving a thought-provoking keynote address at the opening session on each occasion. The staff of Snehalaya being aware that it was the first major SVD gathering to take place under their roof went out of their way to do everything for the seminar's unfolding. It was indeed armed with the warm feeling of having lived through a wholesome learning experience that the participants returned to their respective formation communities.

KATKARI WELFARE PROGRAM

SARVA VIKAS DEEP, MANGAON



Sarva Vikas Deep (SVD) has been working for more than 15 years for the welfare and upliftment of the Katkari Tribals in Mangaon. The Government of Maharashtra has introduced a revised Katkari Uthan Abhiyan or Katkari Welfare Program. The objective of the program is that every tribal in Raigad district in a combing operation should be dispensed with all the government documents because of which they are deprived of government schemes. In the past six months, on a war footing, Sarva Vikas Deep (SVD) and the district administration i.e., Collector Office, Local Sub-divisional office: SDO and Tahsildar have been working in tandem to formalise all the documents viz. caste certificates, ration cards, land documents, Aadhar cards, E-Shram cards, PAN cards, job cards etc. All in all, in six months, SVD has been able to procure

more than 1500 E-Shram cards, 800 caste certificates, 100 ration cards and income certificates. On 5 August 2022, under the Katkari Uthan Abhiyan, the Sub-collector, Tahsildar, and Sarva Vikas Deep jointly distributed government documents. As a token distribution, the government officers distributed 55 caste certificates, 313 E-Shram cards, 11 ration cards, and 4 income certificates to the people belonging to 11 Adivasi villages. The rest of the documents were distributed in their respective villages. These documents will come in good stead to avail all the government schemes.

ST. MONICA'S DAY CELEBRATION AND RETREAT

UCDC, BANDRA



On 3rd July 2022, 150 members of women Self-Help Groups had annual planning meeting for the year 2022-23. As per that plan, St. Monica's Day celebration is one of the activities for the month of August. The women had also decided to prepare themselves spiritually in order to celebrate the St. Monica's Day in a worthy manner. Therefore, they had half day Charismatic Retreat on 21st August 2022. Around 250 women and 20 men participated in the retreat. This retreat for the migrants was organized by Divine Word Retreat ministry led by Fr. Joe Prabhu SVD. The preachers were from Tabor Ashram, Kalyan. The participants were extremely happy to get a beautiful opportunity to have Charismatic Retreat for the first time in view of St. Monica's Day.

St. Monica's Day celebration was a great day for the Archdiocese of Bombay as 15 Units/Centres of Archdiocesan Migrant Commission (AMC) came together for the celebration. The program began with the Holy Mass. There were more than one thousand people for the Mass. The main celebrant was Fr. Angelus Ekka SJ from St. Peter's church, Bandra. The melodious choir was conducted by Mount Mary and Lalmati Groups. Fr. Andrew broke the Word of God. At the end of the Mass Fr. Glasten thanked everyone for their active participation in the day's celebration.



Second part of the program was in St. Theresa's school hall. The participants were given coupon for the entry well in advance. Refreshments were given before the program. Ms. Mishal Dabre from the Centre for Social Action welcomed everyone for the stage program. The program began with a meaningful prayer dance by the students of Urban Community Development Centre. Fr. Cosmos officially introduced and welcomed all the units. Explaining the main objective of the celebration he said that it was aimed at strengthening the networking of units of the Archdiocesan Migrant Commission. Second objective was to promote and preserve the art and culture of Chotanagpur region. Third one was to honour St. Monica who is recognized as the patron saint of mothers. There were 10 centres which participated in the cultural dance competition organized on the day. After the dance competition Rt. Rev. Bp. John Rodrigues addressed the migrant community and encouraged them to progress in life saying; "if you want to reach fast, go alone, and if you want to reach far, go together." He also emphasized the need for networking and working together. At the end of his talk he also distributed the prizes to all the winning Units. Fr. Glasten from AMC thanked all the participants and the unit heads.

INM DISASTER MANAGEMENT POLICY IN THE MAKING



A meeting of confreres from the various JPIC centres in INM was held at Atma Darshan on Thursday, 11th August 2022 along with the Provincial Superior and the Mission Secretary, to discuss and deliberate upon a working paper, in the process of drafting a disaster management policy for the INM Province. Fr. Richard Mathias, Provincial Superior, INM addressed the confreres gathered from across the province and initiated the discussion. The sessions were presided over by Fr. Richard Quadros. It may please be recalled that our Generalate has already drafted a Disaster Management policy for the whole Society and has recommended to all the provinces to come up with a Disaster Management policy. The participants of the meeting were Frs. Richard Mathias, Jolly Kuriakose, Richard Quadros, Mathew Korattiyil, Cosmos Ekka, Mahipal Toppo, Michael Pereira, Richard D'Almeida, Mathew Nirappal Joe Prabhu, Babu Kakkaniyil and Mrs. Susan Norohna (DDW).

The participants had a rather elaborate discussion on the Working Paper prepared by Fr. Richard Quadros in consultation with the Resource Persons of the Disaster Management Workshop - Prof. Jacqueline Joseph and Prof. Mahesh Kamble, held in March 2022, in order to make a draft policy on Disaster Management. The meeting delegated a three member committee, headed by INM JPIC Coordinator, Fr. Babu Kakkaniyil and Frs. Richard Quadros and Mathew Korattiyil, to come up with the Policy and submit it to the Provincial Council by the end of October 2022.

KERALA AND THE MIGRANTS' WELFARE SCHEME SARVA SEVA SANGH, KERALA

Sarva Seva Sangh, Kerala involved in the empowerment of guest labourers (inter-state migrants) in Kerala has joined hands with the State Government in enrolling the guest labourers across the civil districts of Kottayam, Idukki, Ernakulam and Alappuzha, in the newly mandated insurance scheme of

the Government of Kerala for the welfare of the migrants. Sarva Seva Sangh has already organized nine enrolment camps and registered nearly 600 persons in this welfare scheme. The scheme provides Rs. 2,00,000/- for accidental deaths at work site, Rs.25,000/- for medical insurance and Rs. 25,000/- for every case of death and a maximum amount of Rs. 50,000/- for airlifting the dead body to their State of origin. SSS–Kerala is currently involved in availing the benefits of this scheme for one family from Nagaland who lost a member while in Kerala due to the sudden death.

SSS - Kerala is extending various need based services to the migrant population in three districts in their time of crisis. It has also helped over 100 persons for finding suitable jobs with reasonable salary, safe working conditions and with food and accommodation, especially for persons from Assam, Odisha and Jharkhand.

The centre has also swung back to its regular activities of monthly pastoral care which involves confessions, Holy Mass (Hindi and Odiya), and need based counselling guidance and crisis management support. Currently Masses are offered on a monthly basis in 15 places across 8 dioceses and these are attended by nearly 900 people. While Hindi Masses are offered at 13 places, two Masses are offered in Odiya.

A TRIBUTE OF LOVE



On 18 August 2022, we received the shocking news of the untimely demise of Fr. Petrus Kullu, Provincial Superior of India East Province. We had prayed and hoped, when he was in the hospital due to pneumonia and Covid, that he would recover and get back to his job but the divine plan was something different and beyond our comprehension. I attended the funeral service held on 20 August at Jharsuguda and on behalf of the province paid our tribute of love by placing a wreath at his portrait as the mortal remains could not be brought to the church because of the Covid-19 protocols.

Archbp. John Barwa officiated at the funeral Mass held at St. Arnold’s church, Jharsuguda and was attended by three Bishops, all the sub-zone Provincial and Regional Superiors, a large number of SVD confreres, diocesan clergy, religious, family members, relatives, friends and well-wishers. After the Mass he was laid to rest at Shanti Bhavan cemetery.

Fr. Petrus was a simple, calm and unassuming person. His needs were minimum as he was a person contented with what he had. He was a very friendly and sociable person. He spread joy wherever he went as God had gifted him with a jovial disposition. During his formation as well as at later stages of his life and mission, he maintained very good relationship with everyone. He made a lot of friends from within and outside the SVD circle. His composed temperament and friendly nature helped him to handle difficult situations of his life and ministry with ease. He was a community man, and he showed a lot of concern for welfare of the Society. In his sudden and untimely death, we have lost a friend, a loving and caring companion and a committed missionary. May the good Lord who called him to be with Him, reward him with eternal life according to His promises. May he rest in peace! We once again extend our heartfelt condolences to all the confreres of INE and to the near and dear ones and friends of Fr. Petrus.

Keeping with the norms of the Society, “whenever the superior leaves office before his term has expired, the vice-superior takes over and completes his term”, Fr. Victor Rodrigues has assumed the responsibility of the Provincial Superior of INE province. We wish him every success in his leadership ministry and pray for God’s blessings.

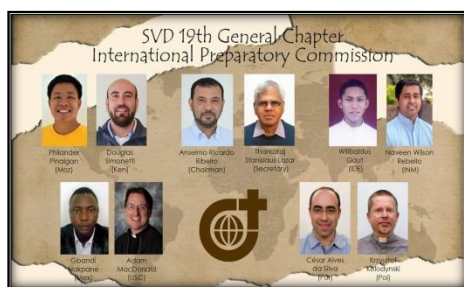
