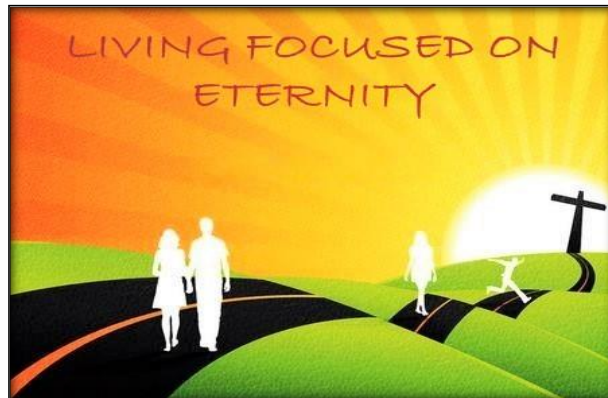
MILESTONES TO HEAVEN

KARAM FESTIVAL ASK, GOA



Karam is a harvest festival celebrated in the Indian states of Jharkhand, West Bengal, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Assam, Odisha and Bihar by the tribal communities. The Karam festival is dedicated to the worship of Karam-Devta (Karam-Lord/God), the god of power, youth and youthfulness. It is celebrated for good harvest and health.

Arnold Seva Kendra, Goa (ASK, Goa) organised the Karam festival for the people of Chotanagpur area (Orissa, Jharkhand, Assam etc.) in Goa. It is said that you can take the people away from Chotanagpur but not Chotanagpur away from people. The celebration began with the performance of the Karma Ritual by Fr. Anil Kujur, CSsR, followed by the solemn Eucharistic celebration in Hindi. After the Eucharistic celebration, a traditional dance competition was held where around ten Chotanagpur migrant groups from different parts of Goa participated and displayed their talents and culture. This was followed by a depiction of Overwhelming Joy symbolized by the beautifully dressed 'Kumaris' who danced around the symbols of karam and the first fruits of the harvest. The celebration was attended by more than 800 people from different parts of South Goa. Fr. Michael Pereira, SVD, performed the closing Ritual Rite in the nearby rivulet, thus bringing the celebration to its conclusion. As people were

saying good bye to their friends and relatives who had come for the festival, there was a lot of joy and happiness that they could celebrate their cultural feast away from their home land.

KEYBOARD WORKSHOP ALKA, VASAI

Arnold Lalit Kala Academy (ALKA) is a recognized centre for London Trinity Exam from 2019 onwards. There are 80 students appearing for keyboard exam in November 2022 and January 2023, and

This was followed by sharing within the Basic Ecclesial Community. There was a good representation from each family of our mission. The task discussed was to have children's day celebration along with the special children in Carmel Vidya Vikas Kenda, a residential school for the Mentally Challenged Children, Community Based Rehabilitation for persons with Disabilities. This will be held on November 13, 2022. Mattie J.T. Stepanek said, "Unity is strength and when there is teamwork and collaboration, wonderful things can be achieved." This is the kind of experience we taste in and around our parish community. May the BEC gatherings yield more and more fruits in the coming days.

OCTOBER-CONNECT ATMADARSHAN, ANDHERI



'Connect' was the theme of the Atma Darshan Day, celebrated on October 16, 2022. The day celebrated the inauguration of the silver jubilee year, and how over the past 24 years Atma Darshan has connected to people from all walks of life. Special mention has to be made of how Atma Darshan has reached out and kept its doors open to people of other faiths and cultures through their various programmes as well as hospitality. Three members of DDW, Pune visited the INH Missions from 15th to 21st September. We visited the Asha Jyothi, Care and Support centre for boys with HIV/Aids at Pregnapur; the Asha Jyothi, Care and Support centre for girls with HIV/Aids at Jogipet; and the Arnold Bal Vikas Ashram, Rehabilitation Centre for orphans at Nizampet. We spent four days at these centres and interacted with the children and made them feel loved, cared and wanted. We organized and played games with them, entertained them with songs, and held quiz and drawing competitions. We distributed gifts, chocolates, biscuits, and eatables. We arranged a special lunch at all three centres. The children had a lovely time and were emotionally touched by our presence and loving gesture.
