too many things demanding our focus, draining us of our

energies, and blinding us to the big picture. Money only goes so far. Technology can only do so much. Medicines have a short shelf life. All of our human resources are limited. God alone, the inexhaustible source of all that we need, offers them to us in abundance through his beloved son whom he sent into the world as our saviour.

God is always calling us to take a deep look into the broad range of our life and become aware of His ever abiding presence during this Advent season and prepare ourselves to encounter him in his first coming in history, in his second coming in grace in the daily events and realities of our life and in his final coming in power and great glory. Advent is a season of heightened awareness whereby we are called on to live in the awareness that God is continually gifting Himself to us and inviting us to abide in his presence. But, quite often, we do not respond as we ought, as we are oblivious to his presence. "He was in the world, and though the world was made through Him, the world did not recognize Him. He came to His own, and His own did not receive Him (John 1:10-11).

The fact is not that we are unconcerned or apathetic or lazy. The problem is that we pay scarce attention to our inner spirit and our inner selves. This spiritual blindness is spoken of in Biblical language as darkness or night. And what do we do in darkness? It is customary, in all cultures and societies, during this time to sleep. We sleep because we want to shut down, tune out and turn off. Prophet Isaiah calls us to climb the top of the mountain and look for the Lord's yearning to awaken in us the awareness of His presence in our lives and in the circumstances that surround us. In other words, He is calling us to rise above our daily worries, concerns and anxieties in order to introspect and examine whole of our life with all of its peaks and valleys. This is possible only if we view things in Christ, the Light of the World. "For

with you is the fountain of life; in your light we see light." (Ps. 36:9). Therefore, like David, we must consciously expose ourselves to the light, the divine light, while marching forward in faith.

But can we march on being aware of his presence? Yes, we can...if we take time and make space. Can we track the writing of God's finger in the light and shadow days of our existence, in good times and in bad? Yes, we can, if we can tune in to God's presence and grow in familiarity with Him, encountering Him daily at the Eucharist. If we purify ourselves through the Sacrament of Reconciliation we can eagerly look forward to welcome Him with joy. Reading the Word of God daily and meditating would be yet another ideal practice that can help us gain divine insights into the events of our life. Spending extra time in thoughtful reflection and quiet prayer would be an ideal way of sharpening our sense of God's presence in our lives. Loving and serving others and caring for God's creation are other spirited ways of awakening ourselves to the divine presence.

God's promise to be with us, incarnation, in our midst, is deeply entwined with our everyday life, in good times and not so good times. Advent is that gracious season which can transform us into 'faithful and creative disciples', if we are willing to respond to His call in every circumstance and opportunity of our life. Therefore, let us live consciously knowing that we are, as T.S. Eliot described, "Distracted from distraction by distraction", but, let's live being deeply aware of his presence in our midst as Emmanuel - 'God with us'.

# YOUTH ANIMATION PROGRAMME UCDC, BANDRA



UCDC arranged a youth animation session as part of the educational up-liftment programme for 65 migrant youth from the Bandra region. The youth consisted of 9<sup>th</sup> standard to college-going students. They gathered at St. Theresa's school at 06:00 a.m. and registered their names. Two buses

departed at 07:00 am for Lonavala. The youth were very enthusiastic and excited. After reaching Don Bosco school in Lonavala, Fr. Xavier Devadas gave them a warm welcome. He enjoys working with young people who are dealing with addiction and challenging circumstances. He is also deeply committed to protecting creation. Fr. Xavier animated the group for about one and a half hours. He said that in the universe all are masterpieces of God. No one is made a duplicate, all are unique. He gave an example of mango seed, claiming that it has the ability to grow into a tree in its entirety. Similarly each individual has the ability to develop and mature. The hard work of the adolescent period will bear fruits. Destiny is in each one's hand. Either you put in a lot of effort and have a good time for the rest of your life, or you choose to have fun and do the dishes. Each person has the option and choice.



In the second part of the session, he said that human beings tend to find happiness in material things. Some people abuse alcohol, drugs, and smoking. God frequently provides a chance for us to proceed in the correct direction. He claimed that people have the propensity to find happiness in things. You have the choice to make your life better by getting on the horse. Two people in alcohol and drug rehab shared their personal stories with the

youngsters. They claimed that nothing in this world truly brings us joy and peace. Ramesh (name Changed) said that he was working for MNCs (Multinational Companies) and had a lot of name, fame, and money. Over the years, he used all of his income on alcohol and drugs. When he realized that this sort of living was not giving him real peace, he decided to come to Alcohol/Drug rehabilitation at Lonavala. He testified saying that even though one is addicted, he/she still has the chance to make changes in one's life. But one should have the self-awareness and the willpower to come out. Fr. Xavier concluded by saying that life is a gift given to each of us. Ms. Preeti Lakra, a college student, thanked Fr. Xavier for the inspiring sessions. In the afternoon, the youth visited the famous Karla Caves. The Karla Caves is a Buddhist Monastery dating back to the 2<sup>nd</sup> century BC. The youth were really amused by seeing the sculpture and art. The trip to Don Bosco, Lonavala was a success and the youth returned to Mumbai very delighted.

#### THERESIANS CELEBRATE CHILDREN'S DAY



Everyone has an opportunity. This was once again confirmed on Children's Day at St. Theresa's High School, Bandra. This was the first Children's Day celebration after the Pandemic. All the students came in their celebratory coloured dresses to enjoy their special day. On this occasion it was turn of the Teaching and non-teaching staff to showcase their talents and entertain and pass on meaningful messages to children. The Theresian staff left no stone unturned. There was maximum participation of the staff in performing dances, songs, skits, etc. The students were overwhelmed seeing their teachers' performances. The Pre-primary had a Magic Show as special event of the day. At the conclusion of the event, the students relished the snacks served and went home satisfied with the message to live as good human beings.

### **CHILDREN'S ADVOCACY**

Children's Parliament (Bal Sansad) is a concept to empower children and prepare them to participate in a democratic process. The efforts are going on by the SVD in Mangaon and Mhasala taluka to train



children to sensitise their issues and present them to the concerned government departments. There are twelve children's parliaments or bal sansad formed and strengthened. A seventeen-member representation from twelve villages met the Mangaon Block Development Officer, Mr. Y.M. Prabhe; post that they also met the Tashildar, Smt. Priyanka Kamble. This exercise was undertaken to make the children aware of their right to approach government

officials and advocate for their rights. The children raised the issues of safe drinking water facility, quality education etc. This is the first of its kind social advocacy initiative by children themselves. The

children were happy with the learning experience as both the Block Development Officer and Tahsildar encouraged them to approach the government offices.

# UNBOUND CONFERENCE 2022 PRARTHANA NIKETAN, KADUTHURUTHY



A two-day UNBOUND conference was held at SVD Prarthana Niketan, Kaduthuruthy from November 5-6, 2002. To this effect earlier the SVD had done extensive research on 'Understanding the Causes of Child Marriage: its Implications and Interventions among Katkari Community' in collaboration with the College of Social Work, Nirmala Niketan's research department. The village leaders met in two different zones

to discuss the issues that plague them. During the month of October, the village leaders took an initiative

to adopt a resolution for preventing child marriage at the Goregaon and Nizampur zone levels. As part of the immediate deterrent, they have kept a fine and non-cooperation to such marriages that impinge the growth of children.
