#### ENLARGE THE SPACE OF YOUR TENT

The Synod General Secretariat in Rome has come out with the Working Document for the Continental Stage of the Synod on Synodality and in order to help the faithful to understand this stage, the Working Document has used an image from the book of Isaiah 54:2: "Enlarge the space of your tent". The image of a tent envisions the church as "an expansive, but not homogeneous dwelling, capable of sheltering all, but open, letting in and out, and moving toward embracing the Father and all of humanity.", and therefore, the challenge before us is to embrace this vision of a Church which is more inclusive,

welcoming and creating not only symbolizes a more out to welcome all nationality and status but the people on their journey.

Our journey of communion, began six years ago, when announced the election new INM provincial "Enlarge the space of your tent"

space for others. This image expansive Church stretched irrespective of colour, creed, also one that accompanies

participation and mission the Fr. Superior General results and appointed the leadership team. On 2<sup>nd</sup>

Fr. S. M. Michael, Fr. Nicolau D'Costa and I joyfully make space to welcome the new leadership team. Fr. Tomy Thomas and Fr. Richard Quadros along the new entrants - Fr. Raja Ratna Reddy, Fr. Victor Sagayam and Fr. Anthony Menezes will continue their journey of service with renewed commitment. Since the life and mission ahead will be satisfying, and at the same time challenging, we pray for the guidance of the Spirit so that the new team may perceive the mission ahead from the perspective of God and his people and serve joyfully. We are grateful to each confrere in the INM province for giving us the opportunity to be of some service in the fulfilment of our common vision and mission. We wish all the confreres especially the new leadership team the very best as we pray, 'may your light shine before others and may you be faithful and creative disciples of the Lord in a wounded world'.

This rare gathering of such a large number of religious for the Eucharist inspired many parishioners. ## RENEWAL PROGRAMME ORDINATION/FINAL VOWS BATCHES 1978 - 1985



A three days' renewal programme for the confreres of India Subzone, Ordination/Final Vows batches of 1978 to 1985 was organized at Arnold Bhavan, Hyderabad from 6 - 8 February 2023. Fr. Gratian Carlo, SJ was the resource person. Altogether there were 39 participants including twelve confreres from INM. The Renewal Programme began with the Inaugural Mass officiated by Fr. Ignatius Santhuraja, INH Provincial Superior. In

his homily, he urged the confreres to become aware of the presence of God in their life journey and share their experiences with each other. The sessions commenced with the installation of the Bible, lighting of lamp and opening prayer by the organizer, Fr. Luvis Ronald Pereira, Sub-zone Mission Secretary.

The three days' sessions were on the theme: "Psycho-spiritual maturity and integration." The focus was 'inward looking' to make one's life more effective. Fr. Gratian in his presentation helped the participants to see the common assumptions, needs, attitudes and values that hinder one from achieving the goal of becoming like Christ. He explained the psychodynamics of every participant to make the participants aware of their needs and values. He stressed the importance of taking care of the dissonant needs and adapt oneself to the consonant or neutral needs for better functioning and fruitfulness in our lives. He also dealt with the topics such as - effective management of emotions, self-image, interpersonal relationships, influencing, empowering communication, care-fronting, etc. The renewal programme created a lot of awareness among the participants about their personal styles of functioning and made them realize some of the areas they need to change. The last session was dedicated for the sharing by the participants about their learnings/insights and steps towards improvement. Governing Body of India Sub-Zone was thanked for organizing the renewal programme. A special note of appreciation was expressed to the Mission Secretary of India Sub-Zone, Fr. Luvis Ronald Pereira for planning and organizing the programme.

Arnold Nivas, a home for senior citizens, has been a ray of hope for the elderly for the past 9 years. More than 80 elderly people have benefitted from this institution. In the spirit of our founder, St. Arnold Janssen, we have been trying to witness to the love of God through our compassionate service to these elderly inmates; and confidently, we can affirm that the final years of these inmates here are happier and serene. At present, there are 20 inmates (both male & female). On the 18<sup>th</sup> of February, the annual day was celebrated to thank the Lord for the protection and the blessings received during the year. Due to Covid pandemic and the associated challenges, the annual day celebration could not be celebrated for the past 2 years, but this year God granted us the opportunity to celebrate the day together with the SVD confreres, priests and

religious from the Deanery and from the Diocese, family members and relatives of the inmates, neighbours and ward members, benefactors—and well-wishers. The day was marked by the solemn Eucharistic celebration, officiated by the Dean Rev. Fr. Oswald Monteiro and concelebrated by 11 priests and a good number of faithful participating in it. In his homily, Fr. Oswald highlighted the role of a missionary, by saying that "A Missionary first of all experiences the intimacy with God by spending quality time with him, listening and learning from the master and saviour, and thus empowered, proceeds to become a good news through extending the same experience of being with the Lord to the people he

meets". He highlighted the life of our founder and gratefully acknowledged the service SVDs render to the church through the missionary activities. The melodious hymns sung by the parish choir led by Mr. Clifford Leo D'Souza, enabled all to experience the divine presence.

We visited a few SVD communities and experienced the passion and dedication to the mission. Despite limited resources and competition from other Christian groups, our confreres remain optimistic and determined to provide education and spiritual guidance to the people, particularly children. Janssen Minor Seminary, Tezpur, Assam is a community that buzzes with life. Young confreres and seminarians from many tribes, cultures, and belief systems, let ordinary people like us appreciate the wonderful energy vibrating around.

The journey in the company of Fr. Maxim Rodrigues by road to the remote SVD missions has etched a deep and grateful place in our memory. The confreres strive every day through the challenges they face, to make the Lord's Word and His Way a reality. They have small goals and work strenuously to achieve them. Divine Word school, Chayang Tajo is a five-hour drive from Seppa, Arunachal Pradesh, through a twisting hill track and across the lush green mountains. Fr. Clement Miranda, the Principal of the school says that the residents here easily walk a few kilometers up and down these steep slopes every day. Two hours' drive down the slope is the Divine Word school, Nari *Camp*. People in Chayang Tajo and Nari Camp are from the Nyishi and Puroik tribes. To be accepted by these communities, one must be one of them, and our confreres have adjusted to their way of living. There is no doubt that our founder discovered the living Heart of Jesus in every human being and that his missionaries may reach the most remote places to announce the good news of love and hope to people.

### NATIONAL BIBLICAL CONFERENCE



Isaiah 54:2 reads, "Enlarge the Space of your Tent". With this verse in mind, the National Biblical Conference for Priests and Religious was organized by the India Subzone Biblical Coordinator at Divine Word Centre, Vadipatti, Tamil Nadu, on February 11 and 12, 2023 with the focus, 'Moving towards a Synodal Church in Indian context'. Sixty four men and women religious from 16 different congregations participated in the seminar with Fr. Mohandass, Fr.

Wilson, Fr. Joe Prabhu, Fr. David and Fr. Cyril Edward as participants from INM province. Bp. Antonysamy Peter Abir, the Chairman of CCBI Bible Commission and the Bishop of Sultanpet delivered

the keynote address on the topic – 'Enlarge the Space of Your Tent' in which he reiterated the need of the Church to grow in symphony, solidarity and synergy and explained that we can't journey ahead without journeying together. This was further enhanced by His Grace Antony Pappusamy, the Archbishop of Madurai during his Presidential Address wherein he explained that by virtue of Baptism we are all equals but with functional differences.

The two day seminar was vivaciously organised wherein experts presented their papers on the following topics: 1. The Concerns and Expectation of the Participatory Bodies in Indian Church from the Synod on Synodality 2. Synodality: Biblical Perspectives and Implications 3. Synodal Church: Interfaith and Intercultural Dialogue and Dissent 4. Synodality and the Challenges of Religious life in India: Lukan Appeals and Contemporary Viabilities 5. Synodal Spirituality: Solidarity, Inclusion and Participation 6. Women in Synodal Church: Ideal and Real Challenges and 7. St. Paul and Synodality – Practical implications. The academic knowledge and practicality of the resource persons made the topics very appealing to the participants and helped them to connect with their life be it their personal, spiritual or community life. The papers presented also questioned the way of life we religious are living and suggested the solutions to better it and ultimately make the Church Synodal in nature and practice. The sessions ended with some personal introspection with regard to the lessons learned and how to apply those in one's life and use them to live as free persons. Overall, the seminar though very academic, was also very much pastorally oriented as it had insights for the religious to better themselves first and then better others, ultimately enhancing the nature of the Church as walking in the footstep of Christ led by the Holy Spirit.
