### MANGAON: LAYING THE FOUNDATION STONE FOR THE NEW SCHOOL



A new leap in the chapters of the SVD Mission in the district of Raigad, Maharashtra commenced by laying the foundation stone for Saint Arnold's Central School, Mangaon on 29th May 2023. The ceremony was graced by Most Rev. Alwyn De Silva, Auxiliary Bishop Emeritus of Bombay, Rev. Fr. Tomy Perumprayil SVD, the INM Provincial, SVD confreres, priests and nuns of Raigad deanery and parishioners of St. Arnold Parish, Mangaon. In his message to the august gathering, Bishop Alwyn De Silva appreciated the SVDs for their tireless availability to the mission and the new venture in the form of a school for quality education. Fr. Tomy Perumprayil SVD, while addressing the gathering reiterated the commitment made by the past INM Chapters to start a CBSE school for the betterment of the people in and around Mangaon with a special reference to tribal children and their educational empowerment. Fr. Richard Quadros, SVD, the local mission animator

presented a short history of the purchase of land and the building construction per se. The function ended with a sumptuous meal prepared by the Cannosian Sisters who are collaborating with the SVDs in Mangaon mission ventures.

### **CONGRATULATIONS TO FR, NAVEEN REBELLO**



Fr. Naveen Rebello SVD brilliantly defended his doctoral dissertation on Monday, May 8, 2023 at the Pontifical Biblical Institute (famously called the "Biblicum"), Rome – the Roman Catholic Church's premier institute of

biblical studies. His defense was attended by more than hundred SVD confreres, priests, religious men and women, friends, students and members of the academic community at the Aula Paulina, Biblicum. Fr. Naveen wrote his dissertation titled, "Recognizing the Messiah: A Study of Antithetical Anagnorisis in the Gospel of Matthew" in which he explored the use of ancient literacy device of "recognition" that was employed by the evangelist Matthew in various encounter scenes of divine-human interactions in order to communicate a unique revelatory epistemology. He prepared the doctoral dissertation under the guidance of Prof. Henry Pattarumadathil SJ, an expert in the Gospel of Matthew and a professor of New Testament exegesis as well as the Dean of the Biblicum. Besides him, the doctoral commission consisted of Prof. Michel Kamanzi SJ, the world-renowned Prof. Ronald D. Witherup PSS, Prof. Paolo Costa and was presided over by Prof. Fr. Michael Kolarcik SJ, the Rector of the Biblicum. The board of examiners commended the high-quality exegetical work undertaken by Fr. Naveen and appreciated his ability to analyze the Greek texts of the Gospel of Matthew and many other Hebrew texts critically and logically and offering an illuminating synthesis of the research conclusions. Following the excellent presentation of thesis by Fr. Naveen for 25 minutes, there was an engaging question and answer session that lasted for one and a half hour during which he demonstrated his excellent knowledge of the ancient classical (Greco-Roman) and the biblical literature particularly the Gospel of Matthew. For his brilliance both in the high quality of written work and the clarity and scholarship of public defense, Fr. Naveen was awarded Summa cum Laude, the highest honors at the Biblicum. In fact, he became the 26<sup>th</sup> Indian to earn a doctorate in the Sacred Scripture (SSD) successfully and has the distinction of being the first Indian to obtain the honors of Summa cum Laude. From the religious congregation of SVD (the Society of the Divine Word) to which he belongs, Fr. Naveen is the first Indian SVD, the second Asian and the tenth SVD globally to obtain an SSD as his immediate predecessor Fr. Ludger Feldkämper, SVD from Germany did it 46 years ago in 1977.

#### YOUTH CAMP FOR MIGRANT YOUTH IN GOA

On the first day, the program was conducted in collaboration with the Human Touch organization where the sessions were conducted on leadership, motivation, Personality Development, group activities, etc. This was followed by a hike on the mountain and later the time was spent in silence and Prayer, this was followed by the campfire where the youth were allowed to display their talents, and the day ended with a value-based movie called "The Spirit". The next day began with a short meditation on the nature at SVD Rubber plantation. The day was full of group activities, sessions on Values of life, quiz, and fun where the youth were divided into four groups, and activities were organized in the group. The camp was focused on the development and motivation of the youth to become future leaders. "These Two days were the wonderful days where we learned the things for our life", said Mary Soreng. "This was the first time that we had such an opportunity to be together as Chotanagpur Youth and we need to have many more such activities where we come together and learn new things." expressed Pricilla Kiro, the President of the Youth group. Fr. Michael Pereira, SVD who was the brain behind the camp thanked all the people who helped to make this camp possible.

#### **5TH SUMMER CAMP OF ALKA**



The 5th summer camp of ALKA 2023 began on 2nd May at 9 pm with a short prayer service organized by the Staff of ALKA and declared open by Fr. Robin Dias the parish priest of St. Francis Xavier church, Giriz. 282 children have taken part in this summer camp. Among these children, 80 have taken part in learning musical instruments namely Keyboard and Guitar. This summer camp consisted of Music, Dance, Acting, Public Speaking, Drawing, Painting, Personality Development, Yoga, Meditation, a Health workshop, and all types of entertaining activities. The main focus of the summer camp was to train the children to build up good characters along with music and dance. During this camp, we organized a few talks on personality development, public speaking, and character building by Fr. John SVD, Fr. Nickson SVD, Fr. Salate SVD, Fr. Mahimai SVD, and Ms. Deepa. We also organized a health workshop for our children. We called our famous doctors

namely Sr. Mary Chettiyar, Sr. Saroj and Sr. Slokshana from Cardinal Gracious Hospital and St. Annes Cancer Institute who gave some health tips to our children. We had also a magic show by the famous magician Mr. Umesh from Delight party entertainment group from Nallasopara and a short film by Fr. Prashant. The drawing workshop was conducted by Sir. Amit and Fr. Nickson. Character-building action songs by our SVD Brothers and Fr. Mahimai Sundar are very much appreciated. We had a lot of fun games conducted by Mr. Santhosh, Teachers Deepa, Candice, Aloma, and our SVD Brothers. We had different types of dances namely classical, western, and folk taught by Mr. Vinod and Mr. Amit, the famous dancer, and choreographer of Vasai Land. The main focus of the evening summer music camp – was to train the children how to read music. We have Fr. Salate and Sir Vincent who all specialized in keyboards and Sir Joseph who specialized in Guitar. They all worked hard to train them. Rev. Msgr. Francis Correa and Ms. Larissa Almeida, the famous singer from Vasai was the Guest of the day. Both of them addressed our Students and emphasized the importance of practice, ie, riyaaz in all forms of art, be it singing or dancing. Kudos to all the Participants, teachers, and staff.

#### **DDW PUNE - VISIT TO BAILHONGAL, BELGAUM MISSION**



Five members from DDW Pune visited the mission station at Bailhongal, Belgaum from 1st May to 5th May 2023. Fr. Richard D'Almeida, SVD was kind enough to take us to various mission centers. One of the villages we visited was at Mekalmardi, where we witnessed

the missionary work of Fr. Richard who started a unit of forty women from different faiths, engaged in making beautiful and strong laundry bags, handbags, and carpets using jute, leather, and metal. These bags are sold and also exported to Spain, which fetches the women a fair wage for their livelihood. We experienced hard work and self-confidence, especially the women. We also visited the Aragopa village where we met thirteen all-



women self-help groups initiated by Fr. Richard, SVD. Every group met once a month and collected Rs. 100, which is used for their livelihood. Some women also took a loan from the bank and started small businesses making a large number of chapatis using a chapati-making machine and catering for local orders. In another village, we also visited self-help groups that were functioning in the same manner. In this village around 50 children attended tuition classes in the evenings. However, this year the classes were discontinued, as they could not afford Rs. 2000 per month salary for the Tuition Master. We have volunteered to help the village so that the children could avail the classes for the entire year.Fr. Richard also took us to the Carmel Vidya Vikas Kendra Bailhongal School where handicapped children study. We could not meet the children as they were on holiday; nevertheless, we sponsored lunch for the children, which Fr. Richard will arrange when school reopens. We also visited Vidya Mandir Primary School, Madanbhavi where children were enjoying their summer club. We spent some time with the children and had fun with them. We also visited sick people in the villages. It was a very enriching mission experience for all of us. God bless our SVD fathers. May the heart of Jesus live in the hearts of all – St. Arnold Janssen.

## REMINDERS

#### **CHAPTER DIRECTIVES**

#### **COMMUNITY GATHERINGS/MEETINGS**

To evolve ourselves into emotionally and spiritually nourishing communities, confreres in the community gather at least once a day for prayer, meals or recreation (INM Chapter 2003, Recommendation # 2).

Superiors organize monthly community/staff meetings with an agenda and document the decisions (INM Chapter 2009, Recommendation # 3).

#### **CLARIFICATION OF ROLES**

The Chapter recommends that in the beginning of each academic year, to create an atmosphere of life-giving relationships and team work, the community meets together and considers clarification of roles. The Chapter also recommends that the Provincial, in the course of his regular visits to the communities facilitates community building exercise and resolves conflicts, if any." (INM Chapter 2018, Recommendation # 1)

#### **SHARING OF INFORMATION**

"In order to enhance the community life, the Chapter proposes that the members of the community share the vital and necessary information about their absence and whereabouts to their superior/community members" (Const. 308.2: Out of a sense of community and according to local regulations, one should have permission or inform the superior before leaving the house.) (INM Chapter 2018, Guideline # 6)

Keeping in mind the adverse consequences, the Chapter recommends that the confreres exercise discretion with regard to sharing the internal matters of our communities and the province with outsiders, and exercise prudence and caution. (INM Chapter 2018, Recommendation # 3)

### **PREPARATION OF ACTION PLAN**

Recommendation No. 4 (INM Chapter 2009) states that in the beginning of the academic year each community prepares an Action Plan with an inbuilt mechanism for its execution, which is reviewed periodically, documented and reported to the Provincial Superior. Hence, I request the Superiors to call for a meeting and re-visit the Vision and Mission and prepare the Action Plan for the community/institute. As you prepare the Action Plan kindly remember to pay due importance to all the four characteristic dimensions of our mission: Biblical Apostolate, Communication, Mission Animation and JPIC.
