

of almost every bishops' conference to the *Lineamenta* of XIII synod of bishops highlight the following reasons observable among Christians: "a weakening of faith in Christian communities, a diminished regard for the authority of the magisterium, an individualistic approach to belonging to the Church, a decline in religious practice and a disengagement in transmitting the faith to new generations."

The Church therefore in our times is called to examine the way Christian communities both live and bear witness to the faith today. It has profound implications for our mission of proclamation. The Emmaus Gospel account (Lk 24:13-35) narrates that the two disciples walked to Emmaus from Jerusalem in the wake of the resurrection of Jesus, discussing with each other about "all these things that had happened" (v. 14). Then, Jesus himself joins their journey, walking alongside, interacting with them, interpreting to them "the things about himself in all the scriptures" (v. 27), leading them to recognize him in the

breaking of the bread and eventually vanishing from their sight. No sooner had Jesus vanished than the disciples realized the fire that was kindled in them. Their hearts were burning within them, as they reminisced what had just happened – *the encounter with the risen Lord*. They said, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road, while he was opening the scripture to us" (v. 32). Like the disciples, we need to let the risen Lord encounter us in our life journey, enkindle our hearts with the fire of his love and empower us with his living Word. The living Word is a lamp to our feet and a light to our paths of mission (Ps 119:105) in a world wounded by inequality, injustice, divisions, conflicts and wars.

The disciples invited Jesus to stay with them as the day was nearly over. Jesus' acceptance of their invitation was an occasion for them to encounter the risen Christ. The sequence of actions performed by Jesus opened their eyes to recognize him: he took bread; blessed and broke it; and gave it to them. It is in the breaking of the bread that we experience the profoundness of our faith and missionary discipleship. Christ, who breaks the bread, now becomes the bread broken, shared with the disciples and consumed by them. He is seen no longer, for 'he vanished from their sight'. He is invisible. He is risen. Yet he lives in the hearts of the disciples to make them burn with his love and compassion for the world. The risen Christ, then, is both the one who breaks the bread and, at the same time, the bread itself, broken for us. It is this experience of meeting the Lord in the breaking of the bread that sets their hearts on fire and their feet on the move. For, they 'set out without delay and returned to Jerusalem' (v. 33) to share with others what had happened to them. Eucharist is not only the source and summit of the life of the Church, but it is also the source and summit of her mission. A mission that flows from and leads to the Eucharist. Amid present-day challenges, a celebration of World Mission Sunday invites us, the missionary disciples, to set our hearts on fire and our feet on the move to become bread broken for others in mission.

Antonio Pernia SVD our former Superior General during our meeting. We also visited the Pink sisters and the SVD confreres at the Divine Word Institute of Mission Studies (DWIMS) and the major seminarians at Tagaytay. We had the joy of meeting many SVD lay mission partners on our last meeting day. It was truly an experience of intercultural collaboration experience being SVD's.

ASPAC ZONAL ASSEMBLY OF THE JPIC COORDINATORS IN BANGKOK



The ASPAC Zonal Assembly of the JPIC Coordinators took place from 19th to 24th July 2023 at Camillian Pastoral Care Centre, Bangkok, in the Australian Province. Along with Bro. Carlos Ferrada SVD, the Generalate JPIC Coordinator, Fr. Gabriel Suban Koten SVD, the ASPAC Zonal coordinator and Fr. Albano Da Costa SVD, the vice - Provincial of Australia province, Fourteen JPIC Coordinators of various PRMS (AUS, BGD, IDE, INC, INE, ING, INH, INM, JPN, PHC, PHS, SIN, VIE & PGN) and Fr. John Le from Thailand participated in the

Zonal Assembly. The theme of the assembly was "Your Light Must Shine Before Others" (Mt: 5:16), ASPAC JPIC- Faithful and Creative Disciples in a Wounded World." Fr. Babu Kakkaniyil represented INM in the Assembly. In the first session, Bro. Carlos Ferrada SVD, the Generalate JPIC Coordinator presented on the theme of Laudato Si initiatives by SVDs. He shared the good works of SVDs and SSpS and explained the seven years of action platform.

He also explained the fourfold approach such as prayer, Education, Action, and Advocacy. He said "Care for the environment is not only part of our Mission; it is also part of our heritage. (#44 - 3.4.2 – Docs 18th GC 2018). The second session was on the initiatives and interventions undertaken by the VIVAT Office in the field of Advocacy and the need for greater collaboration between VIVAT and JPIC personnel. Fr. Babu Kakkaniyil, the INM JPIC Co-ordinator then had his presentation titled "Walking with the migrants – Our Mission and Mandate Today". Starting from the global scenario of migration, he moved on to migration in the ASPAC and then to the India- Subzone. He also briefed the assembly about the various interventions of INM for the empowerment and welfare of migrants and refugees. Pointing to the

key trends of the migration he invited to have a heart for the least, last, and the lost. This was followed by the Management of an NGO and finances. This was followed by sharing by the JPIC co-ordinators of the various Provinces. The sessions and the sharing made everyone feel the variety of interventions undertaken by the Arnoldus family. The Assembly identified three target groups and areas of intervention for the coming triennium (2023-'26), namely, working for the migrants and refugees, environment, and human rights.

ASPAC BIBLICAL COORDINATORS ASSEMBLY IN BANGKOK



ASPAC Biblical Coordinators Assembly took place at the Camillian Pastoral Care Centre in Bangkok from September 25–29, 2023. Sixteen Coordinators from the 20 PRMs in ASPAC were present for the Assembly. They were joined by three resource persons: Wojciech Szupula, SVD General Biblical Apostolate Coordinator, Gabriel Suban Koten, SVD ASPAC Zonal Coordinator, and Jan Stefanow, Secretary General, Catholic Biblical Federation. There were also four non-SVD invitees from Thailand and Myanmar. Jose Kollemkunnel (INC), Valan Stephen (INH), and Matthew Kavukatt (INM) participated from India. Justine

Thomas (Bangladesh Mission) and Wilson Jacob (PNG) were the other Indians present. After the input

sessions, each PRM reported their Biblical apostolate activities. It was a good exercise to know what is happening in our Zone. Biblical pastoral ministry by way of bible sharing groups, bible study groups, etc were happening in most provinces. Some ideas regarding the Biblio drama were imparted. There was also a general feeling that the number of confreres involved in Biblical Apostolate has not increased as much as needed. Even among the Coordinators, only three were full-time. Hence, it was felt that more efforts were needed to regain the importance of Biblical Apostolate in our mission as Divine Word missionaries. Some of the ideas that emerged as a consensus among the BA Coordinators during the deliberations were:

- For the Divine Word Missionaries, "Our Name is our Mission." Hence, there is a need to regain the rightful importance of Biblical Apostolate (BA) in its various forms as the central focus of our mission. Thus, it was proposed to suggest an institutional change for the Society in the next General Chapter to make the Biblical Apostolate the main and top priority of the Society.
- In the area of Formation, it was suggested that the Bible and its pastoral use be set as a core formative component in the SVD formation programs, to ensure that the formation of the SVDs prepares them to be the DIVINE WORD Religious Missionaries, not just missionaries.
- Regarding the visibility of the BA, it was agreed that the PRMs will submit regular news reports of their biblical activities at least once a year to the zonal coordinator to be submitted to the Arnoldus Nota. The process will be overseen by the Biblical Apostolate Zonal Coordinator.
- To ensure more effective BA Coordination, it was felt that we need to strive for a full-time Biblical Apostolate Coordinator in PRMs, wherever it is possible. The individual BA coordinators are also to make every effort to create a network of confreres and lay partners to carry out the Biblical Apostolate in the PRMs.
- To ensure the sharing of resources, the BA coordinators will also strive to make the materials available to other PRMs by using social media apps.
- To continue the spirit of collaboration and communion, the BA Zonal Coordinator will also organize annual on-line meetings among the BA coordinators in the ASPAC Zone.
- Regarding the Dei Verbum Course in the ASPAC Zone, it was proposed that the ASPAC Zonal Assembly set up a committee to conduct a feasibility study of a Dei Verbum course in the ASPAC Zone and present its findings to the ZONAL Executive Committee by December 2024.
- Regarding the Catholic Biblical Federation (CBF) membership, it was agreed to encourage the PRMs who are not yet part of the federation, to apply for CBF associate membership.

During the Assembly, one day was also set apart for a sightseeing trip to Bangkok. It gave us an insight into the life and culture of Thailand. We visited a Buddhist temple, the palace, and a shopping area, besides a river cruise for dinner. Bangkok as a tourist destination is indeed a very hospitable, clean, and safe place with plenty of entertainment and fun. After the meeting two of us spent a day visiting the churches and getting a first-hand experience of the migrant ministry of the SVD among the Vietnamese in Bangkok. It was also an eye-opener for me to see that there are many Christian refugees from Pakistan in Bangkok, who flee the persecution in their country.

SSS PUNE ORGANIZES A MARATHON FOR THE CAUSE OF CHILD BEGGARY, AND CHILD LABOUR



'Run against child beggary', a short marathon was organized on 8 Oct 2023 at Yerwada, Pune by Sarva Seva Sangh. The marathon was flagged off by Adv. Avinash Salve the municipal corporator of Yerwada, at 6:30 am from Lokshahir Annabhau Sathe Rang Mandir, Yerwada along with Mr. John Paul, former municipal corporator of Yerwada, and Rev. Fr. Tomy Thomas, the provincial superior of SVD India, Mumbai province. The marathon proceeded through Gunjan Corner, Yerwada Bridge, Sadal Baba Chowk, Deccan College road, and returned through Tarkeshwar Chowk to Lokshahir Annabhau Sathe Rang Mandir and there it was concluded. The Short Marathon of 5.2 km was organized to create public awareness of child beggary and child labor. More than 500 people joined in this event from different walks of life. Many Youths from CYDA, students and staff from Christ College, staff and scholastics from Divine Word Seminary, Fransalian Seminary, team members from SeeCubic Pvt. Ltd, Brisalcone Pvt. Ltd, Divine Mercy Sports

Group, and many others participated with much enthusiasm. Begging children are at a high risk of meeting with accidents and are vulnerable to substance abuse and addiction. They also lose their education and their childhood. By giving money to begging children one makes a child a beggar for life, instead giving to needy children what they need, namely, food, water, sanitary materials, study materials, etc. The marathon was to call the attention of people to this social evil and to join together to end this social evil of child beggary and child labor by making affirmative responses and by making others aware of the same.

SARVA SEVA SANGH, KERALA CELEBRATES KARAM FESTIVAL WITH THE MIGRANTS



The small town Changanasserry in South Central Kerala witnessed a rare festival of its kind and a gathering of over 1400 migrant tribal people from North and North East India on Sunday, 15th October, 2023. They had gathered from across the Seven districts of Kerala, namely, Idukki, Kottayam, Ernakulam, Trissur, Alappuzha, Pathanamthitta, Thiruvananthapuram and Quilon to celebrate the exciting and rare festival called Karam. These 1400-plus tribal migrants hail from the States of Jharkhand, Assam, Odisha, Chhattisgarh,

West Bengal, Bihar, and Arunachal Pradesh. Sarva Seva Sangh – Kerala, the centre for the empowerment of migrant labourers, organised this tribal festival and brought together over 1400 Adivasi migrant labourers from across South and South Central Kerala. Karam is a harvest festival celebrated by various tribal communities, including the Oraon, Munda, and Ho tribes, who are indigenous to the region and the people pray to God for a good harvest. This has been the first time in Kerala that the tribals had an opportunity to celebrate this festival.



The Karam festival celebrations began with the Holy Eucharist in Hindi at St. Mary's Church, Parel and was presided over Fr. Nicholas Barla, the CBCI Secretary for the Tribal communities, New Delhi and Fr. Babu Kakkaniyil, Director of Sarva Seva Sangh -Kerala and Fr. Mathew Chennakudy, Rector of St. John's Mission Seminary were concelebrants with him. The traditional dances and singing during the Eucharist made it a great experience. The Holy mass was followed by lunch and the traditional Karam celebrations in the Seminary premises. The

beating of the drums, singing and music and the excellent dances made this a memorable day for the migrant tribals in Kerala. Sarva Seva Sangh arranged this event as part of its many efforts for the welfare and empowerment of migrant labourers.
