#### UCDC CELEBRATES HARVEST AND KARAM FESTIVALS

Urban Community Development Centre (UCDC) is working towards unity, dignity and progress of the



Migrants from Chotanagpur. UCDC together with the Archdiocesan Migrants Commission (AMC) celebrated the Harvest and Karam Festival on the 8th of October 2023 at St Theresa's School Ground, Bandra. There were around Four Thousand migrants from Chotanagpur, who participated actively. The event had two parts: First, the Harvest Festival and the second, the Karam Festival (Cultural Festival). The first part consisted of Thanksgiving Mass for the first harvest. Fr. Praful Bara from Ranchi Archdiocese was the main celebrant.

In his Homily, Fr. Praful explained how our ancestors thanked the Divine for all the blessings they had received in their lives and today we need to be grateful to God for all the blessings. The concelebrants were Fr. Lawrence Correa SVD, the Director of UCDC, Fr. Henry D'Souza SVD, the Parish Priest of St. Theresa Parish, Fr. Glasten Gonsalves, Archdiocesan Migrants Commission, Fr. Donald D'Souza SVD, Fr. Amit Kujur SJ, Fr. Sunil Tirkey Norbertine, Fr. Lenoy Tharakan SJ and Fr. Cosmos Ekka SVD.

The Mass began with an entrance dance by faithful from four zones, namely, Bandra Station Zone,



Mount Mary-Lalmati Zone, Bandh Zone and St. Theresa Bandra Zone. The Bible procession Dance was performed by men for the first time in the history of St. Theresa. The offertory dance was performed by small children, which was appreciated by most of the faithful. The second part was the Karam Feast Celebration. Karam Feast is mainly celebrated by the Tribals, who are animists. One of the Tribals was a pujari to worship Karam Branch. The purpose of Celebrating Karam Feast which is a Cultural Feast was to include people

of other faiths during the celebration. The main objectives of celebrating the Cultural Festival, first of all, is to bring unity among the Tribal/Adivasis of Chotananagpur, and secondly, to promote and protect their Arts, Cultures and Languages. The stage program began with a prayer dance performed by the youth of Bandra.

Fr. Glasten, on behalf of the Archdiocesan Migrants Commission (AMC), called all the Priests, Sisters



and other dignitaries on the stage and felicitated them all. He mentioned that we have been working in the Mumbai Archdiocese in 19 units in different parts. Fr. Lawrence Correa the Director of UCDC, wished a happy feast to all and also told people that we are with them in times of their difficulties. Dr. Bipin Jojo in his address gave more importance to the Tribal Identity Crisis. It is through education we can get rid of poverty and inhuman treatment at workplaces. The women's Self-help Groups had put up 8 stalls

of eateries and a stall for the sale of sarees. The Tribals/ Adivasis are not into business. They were thrilled with the experience. Most of the groups got sizable profits with the sale. The Sisters, Doctors and nurses from Holy Family Hospital had put up a First Aid station. The Hindi Community is very grateful to them.

Fr. Cosmos thanked everyone. The people of Bandra Station zone performed a beautiful Karam Dance on the stage. The event ended with a common dance by all. Festival is one of the best means to bring the Tribal Migrants together. For the Tribal of Chotanagpur, this was an excellent opportunity to come together and share their experiences. We are confident that the Migrants will get a platform to reach out to any Units of the Archdiocesan Migrant Commission at the time of their distress.

We also arrange special retreats as and when it is possible. Most of these retreats are conducted at Atma Darshan Chapel. We sincerely thank the staff of Atma Darshan for providing the space and all necessary facilities. We especially thank all the communities on the campus, Gyan Ashram, Institute of Indian Culture, Soverdia House, St.

Arnold's School, and Sacred Heart Church and all the conferrers who have taken a keen interest in these retreats and continue to contribute to different ways by giving talks, hearing confessions, celebrating the Holy Eucharist, giving their space for conducting the retreats and accommodating the retreatants, especially during residential retreats. The second weekend was dedicated to raising awareness about the proposed St. Arnold's Degree College building on the SVD campus. Fr. Raja Reddy SVD and Fr. Jolly Mudakkampurathu SVD addressed the parishioners and encouraged them to get involved in supporting the college building project.

Lucas Parkhe SVD, as well as three social workers from the Tala mission, enlightened the parishioners on their work in the tribal areas.


#### INM ASSEMBLIES & CHAPTER
