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SYNODALITY AND ST. ARNOLD JANSSEN



Synodality refers to the idea of walking together, a concept deeply rooted in the principles of dialogue, collaboration, and shared decision-making within the Catholic Church. St. Arnold Janssen, the founder of the Society of the Divine Word (SVD), the Holy Spirit Sisters (SSpS), and the Holy Spirit Adoration Sisters (SSpSAP). St. Arnold Janssen may not have used the term "synodality" himself, but his life and work embody many of its principles. St. Arnold Janssen believed in fostering a collaborative and participatory approach to ministry. His vision was to create religious communities that transcended national and cultural boundaries, working together for the common mission of spreading the Gospel. Here's how St. Arnold Janssen's life and work align with the principles of synodality:

International Collaboration: St. Arnold founded the Society of the Divine Word, Holy Spirit Sisters and the Holy Spirit Adoration Sisters, emphasizing international collaboration among missionaries. His communities were composed of members from various cultural backgrounds, fostering a sense of unity and shared purpose.

Consultation and Dialogue: St. Arnold valued consultation and dialogue among the members of his communities. Decisions were often made collectively, with an emphasis on listening to the insights and perspectives of all members.

Inclusivity and Shared Responsibility: St. Arnold believed in the importance of shared responsibility within religious communities. He encouraged each member to contribute their unique gifts and talents to the mission, fostering an inclusive and participatory approach.

Adaptability and Flexibility: St. Arnold's approach to mission work demonstrated adaptability and flexibility. He recognized the importance of tailoring missionary efforts to the specific needs and contexts of different cultures, reflecting the synodal principle of discernment and adaptation.

Prayer and Discernment: St. Arnold valued prayer and discernment as essential components of decision-making. Synodality emphasizes the role of prayerful discernment in seeking God's guidance, and St. Arnold's communities incorporated this spiritual dimension into their collaborative processes.

While St. Arnold Janssen lived in a different historical and ecclesial context, his commitment to international collaboration, consultation, inclusivity, adaptability, and prayer aligns with the spirit of synodality. As the Catholic Church explores and emphasizes synodality in the present day, St. Arnold Janssen's legacy continues to serve as an inspiration for collaborative and mission-focused communities within the Church.

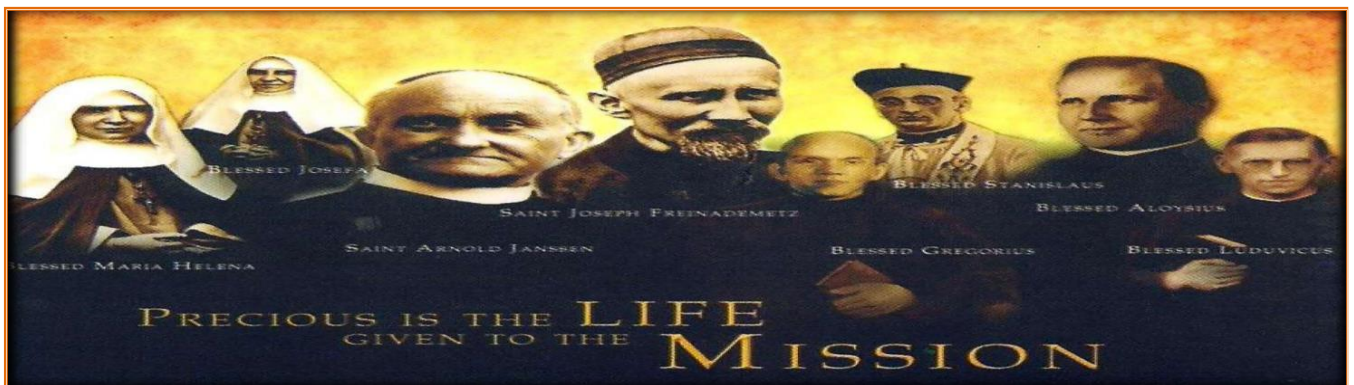

DDW PUNE – MISSION VISIT TO BANDERDEWA, ARUNACHAL PRADESH



In November 2023, we got the opportunity to visit the missions in Arunachal Pradesh. The Banderdewa mission was started by Br. Prem Bai (aka Henry Kashinath Gaikwad) a Maharashtrian by birth. Since his arrival in 1981, he dedicated his life to the missions in Assam and Arunachal Pradesh, where he baptized about 25000 people and built about 128 churches. In 2001 he set up the Holy Trinity Ashram at Banderdewa with a small school and a dispensary. His compassion, generosity and simplicity endeared the locals so

much that when he died in Sri Lanka in June 2008, they insisted on bringing his body to Banderdewa for burial. Many consider him a Saint and the process for canonization is underway. Today Banderdewa is adorned with a beautiful church and school, which is managed by the Parish priest - Fr. Chackochen assisted by Fr. Cyprian Tirky, SVD and Dn. Pradeep Beck. During our visit, we were privileged to attend the inauguration and the blessing of the Sacred Heart Church, Itanagar. It is the largest church in the Itanagar Diocese which is built with the generous contributions of the local people only. We visited Itanagar Bishop's House and met Bp. John Thomas, Bp. Benny Varghese and Bp. Thomas Pullopilly. We also visited missions in the Roing area - Krick & Boury Memorial Schools at Tezu and Sunpura; Divine Word School at Roing; Janssen Youth Training Centre at Solabasti (Assam), and the SVD Regional House at Guwahati (Assam). The church in Arunachal Pradesh is a testimony to the Christian world of how the participation of the laity can accelerate the spread of the Gospel.

MESMERIZING MEMORIES OF THE NEMI RENEWAL PROGRAM



Two of us from the INM Province - Mahipal Toppo and Mervin J. Noronha - got an opportunity to attend the 89th SVD Tertiate renewal course, initial one month in Steyl, Holland and the remaining two and half months in Nemi, Rome from the 1st of August till the middle of November, this year. It proved to be one of the most enriching, and for some of us, a life-changing experience for the 27 participants. We found ourselves unable to refrain from thanking God for the amazing graces, memorable

moments, profound insights, exciting pilgrimages, and novel realizations gained during this renewal journey. Of the 27 participants who took part in the course, 26 were SVDs, of which one was a Brother from Ghana and a Diocesan priest from Thailand. The course began at the SVD mission house, Steyl, Holland, under the guidance of Kulandaisamy, the Director and Thomas Heck, the Spiritual Director and the Arnold Janssen Spirituality team. It was a time to deepen the knowledge of St. Arnold, our founder, St. Joseph Freinademetz, our first missionary to China and the founding Fathers, Brothers and sisters of our congregation. It was a time to get in touch with our roots, our spirituality, our original vision and our calling and be confirmed strongly in our missionary vocation.



Along with getting in touch with various new developments in theology, missiology, psychology, anthropology, Biblical studies, humanities and cosmology, the program opened our eyes and minds to relate to God, the other and the self in a new way. Ongoing reflections and personal sharing in the smaller and the entire group helped us to understand the beauty and richness of our missionary vocation and to appreciate the richness of synodality and interculturality and the dangers of Clericalism in the Church. Exploring the various

enchancing places, from churches to sanctuaries and holy tombs across Europe, has woven a spell of reverence and awe in us. Contemplating the lives of saints, popes, and martyrs who have profoundly influenced the faith of Catholics and believers over the years, and visiting their places, we are stirred by the monumental legacy they have bestowed upon the Church through the ages. The churches, relics, and tombs, encountered during the program have left an indelible mark on our memory. Internationally acclaimed speakers from different parts of the world such as the USA, South America, Europe, Australia, Asia-Pacific and Africa, stirred our minds to reflect beyond ourselves and the Church to include every human person as a child of God and to exclude none in our missionary task. Their sharing of real human experiences from the present moment offered invaluable insights into living life as a disciple of Christ. One of the most unforgettable experiences in Steyl, Netherlands was the sharing by the Pink Sisters (SSpSAP). They recounted their encounters with God, their struggles, their weaknesses, their human and love stories and how they turned them into spirituality and prayer. Their voices bore the weight of real-life trials, illuminating their journey toward lives of sanctity. Listening to them, speak of hearing God in

gentle conversation, as if God were an ordinary companion and friend, is truly inspiring, something which we seemed to have lost as the years passed by. The genuine sincerity in their words resonated with a profound yearning, a deep longing to connect with God. This poignant reminder reinforces the purpose of our ongoing journey of renewal. Further reflecting on this, reminds us that the very essence of our existence rests on this profound yearning for the Divine. But first, we need to get back on track. Get to the roots. And to do that, we must once again take up our cross, the one we decided to carry when we chose to follow the Lord. Finally a sense of gratitude and thanks to our SVD Congregation and the Province, at the end of the renewal program, we were also able to visit nine countries in Europe, including the famous Marian shrine in Fathima, many SVD communities in Europe and get the glimpse of the life and mission of our confreres.

BALMELA 2023

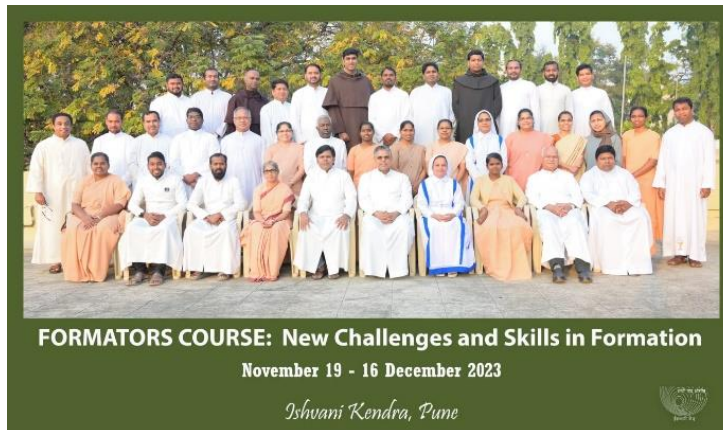

Joseph MT, SVD, all competently and effectively highlighted the challenges and the opportunities for Peace in our hearts, homes and the world. HUMAN RIGHTS DAY CELEBRATION



Maitrisangatan/UCDC organized Human Rights Day on the 9th of December, 2023 for the Focus Group of 150 migrants. The Group consisted of leaders of women's help groups, youth groups, students' groups and area leaders. The event began with a prayer followed by carol singing. Ms. Preeti Lakra welcomed all the participants and introduced the theme: "Freedom, Equality and Justice for All". This year being the 75th year of the

Universal Declaration of Human Rights, we kept the same theme of the United Nations for our event. Fr. Cosmos introduced the resource person, Dr. Sameer Mohite. He is the assistant professor of the College of Social Work, Nirmala Niketan. He is also the president of *Upjeevika* Foundation, Mumbai. During his session, Dr Mohite stressed the rights of the workers such as the rights to start a family life, to own property, and to have healthcare and education. He highlighted the issues affecting the domestic workers.

They are informal in nature, unpaid and underpaid. They have no legal contract and have to face discrimination, violence, sexual harassment and exploitation. Dr Mohite explained 'The Domestic Workers (Regulation of Work and Social Security) Bill, 2017' and also presented in detail 'The Maharashtra Welfare Board Act, 2008'. It speaks about the registration of domestic workers, financial assistance for the education of children, and immediate assistance in case of an accident.



He also told them different procedures to address workplace harassment and reporting mechanisms. The session was very interactive and was animated by the resource person. The resource person made it a very interactive session. He also used a PPT presentation. The women thanked the resource person, and the session ended with tea and snacks. The following day, on the 10th of December a talk on Human Rights was organised by

Maitrisangatan/UCDC. Adv. Sr. Prisca Dias, FC from St. Joseph Convent was the resource person. There were 1,200 participants, mainly maids and domestic workers. The talk was organized in St. Theresa Church, Bandra. In her talk, Adv. Sr. Dias emphasized the rights of the workers. She said that, first of all, the unorganized labourers should avail government documents like PAN, Aadhaar and Bank Account. The unorganized labourers should have workers' identity. She stressed that the labourers should organize themselves to fight against injustice done to them. Mr. Vijay thanked Adv. Sr. Dias for her inspiring talk.
